



Visit to David Nordell's Vintage & Veteran Restorations

The 2017 Christmas Function weekend in Te Awamutu, included a Sunday morning visit to a very talented vintage and veteran car restorer, David Nordell.

David's business is based in Flat Road, near Kihikihi, 6kms from Te Awamutu. He had obligingly parked his 1938 Riley Adelphi near the road as a marker and our convoy of around 25 Model A's filled the surrounding field in soldierly lines.

Gavin Leckner introduced David Nordell, who in turn explained he had been involved full-time with vintage and veteran car restoration and maintenance since 1998. Rare automobiles he had worked on included Bugatti, Mercedes, Isotta Fraschini, Sunbeam, Darracq, Delage, Packard, Wills Sainte Claire, Riley ... and others.

David trained as an engineer, fitter & turner and toolmaker. He had a 6-year grounding in the car restoration business working for Wallace McNair's Straight Eight Restorations in Hamilton, where he cut his teeth on high quality restorations before starting his own business.

It was quickly apparent David was nothing short of meticulous about every single component of his restorations. If necessary, he fabricates in-house a complete chassis, manufactures missing/damaged gearbox, differential, half-shafts, hubs, etc parts and produces or repairs high quality coach built bodies.

From memory, David had 3 Bugattis under restoration in his workshop, including a 1937 Type 57. While our much loved Ford Model A's were valued for their simplicity and roadside 'fixibility', Bugattis were refined expressions of engineering. For people like myself who had never peered into the open heart of a Bugatti, it was a revelation.

It was difficult to prise around 45 North Island Model A Ford Club members away from this very interesting visit, with a host who clearly strives for perfection. Many thanks David for welcoming us to your business and generously sharing your knowledge and skills. What a privilege!

Technical Data

INSTRUMENT PANEL LIGHT TOO BRIGHT?

I have always found the instrument panel light on my Model A to be too bright (and too hot – ouch!). I would turn mine on for a few seconds, and then turn it right back off. Here is a simple fix: put a 12-volt, 3 candle power tail light bulb in your 6-volt Model A instrument panel. That would be a Number 76 bulb, available at any auto parts store. Instead of being so bright, it will glow a nice, soft orange colour because it is operating at half the voltage it was designed for. Once your eyes get used to the dark, it gives all the light you need to see the instruments. You will gladly leave it on for the entire night's drive.

PS The bulb number to do this on a car that has been converted to 12-volt is a Number 263 bulb. Harder to find, usually a special order.



Miscellaneous Ramblings

Old black and silver Registration Plates

If you have an un-registered Ford Model A (or any other old car) with the old black and silver plates, it may be possible to reregister your car using these plates.

In certain circumstances NZTA will allow the re-registration of a vehicle, using its older-style black and silver plates. The following conditions apply –

- The number on the plates must still be available and not in use as a personalised plate.
- The plates must be in good condition.
- You must prove they were the plates issued to the vehicle, when the registration was cancelled. The best evidence is the Certificate of Registration, old insurance documents, a WoF check-sheet, repair certifications, photos of the plates in their current state.

This provision only applies if you are re-registering your vehicle. For example, if your vehicle is currently registered with modern plates, but previously had the older-style black and silver plates, the black and silver plates cannot be re-issued. More details on www.reuseofplates@nzta.govt.nz

Restore your overalls

Overalls almost black with oil and grease? Soak them in Sard Degreaser - available from your supermarket. Add 2 lidsful to 7 litres of warm water in a bucket or tub. Ensure the powder is fully dissolved, then submerge the overalls overnight. Squeeze out the (very black) water the next day and wash separately in your washing machine. Important. Use **Sard Degreaser**, not Sard Stain Remover (a different product).
