

## 50 years ago in the Club (July - August-September 1974)

### From the original Minutes Book:-

At the 10 th July committee meeting, it was decided to postpone the Bay of Island Labour weekend trip and insert Hamilton with an invite to the Rotorua boys.

Goodwright's to be asked to sort venue and accommodation etc. plan for a gymkana etc

Planning for the party on 27 July, Fancy dress-up, club to supply grog at 35c a bottle (quarts) and 30c a nip for spirits. Music from tape deck or record player. Next committee discussed with several standing down, but with some waiting in the wings to hep out manage the club.

A brief meeting 22 nd July to finalize party at VCC, with band etc sorted. A small charge to help pay for venue 50c per person.

Committee meeting 14thAugust, discussion on a 20's party.

The coming AGM agenda set, with mention of increase in subs.

The Hamilton run to be September 28/29 rather than Labour weekend.

AGM, August 26 th, a good turnout of 21 people. The evening started with the usual social chat. Then formal meeting business occurred, with Club Captain Roger Bale, elected, followed by Vice Captain Ray Williams, Newsletter Editor Don Gerard, Secretary Stan Ayling and Committee comprised of Mike Watkins, Arno Westerwoudt, Ian Watson and Ross Ward.

Concours cup was presented to Arno Westerwoudt for his 29 Tudor.

Discussion and subs raised to \$7 for the coming year. A membership card was to be sent out with receipt of subs paid.

A note of thanks to Alan Minson retiring Club Captain for his sterling work. He was then nominated as a Life member to the club and with unanimous acclamation was passed.

Quick meeting Sept 10 th, to change the venue for the party and members were to be phoned with notification.

#### From the Newsletter:- July 1974 Volume 2 issue 9

Members advise of cancellation of the Bay of Islands Run as it clashed with the major VCC event the Hunua 100.

Details of the Hamilton weekend, 28-29 September, meeting up and travelling down, the Gymkana planned for Saturday afternoon, with a run to a place of interest on Sunday.

Reminder of the upcoming AGM, and calling for nominations for committee positions. Note was made in the "A" Torque section that the Manawatu VCC has no less than 14 Model A's on the road. A Model A was clocked at 53 mph of the southern motorway in torrential rain!! One member was approached by a hot rodder to see if his car was for sale, it was envisages a 2" top chop, V8 mill and 15" racing rubber – some have a great sense of humor!! A good source of Films for clubnights was acknowledged.

A technical article was shown on Rear Engine mounts, with the correct placement of the rubber pads. Also several pages on the technical aspects of the Fuel system restoration, including gauge removal.

August 1974 – Volume 2 issue 10

Mention made of the upcoming events, the AGM&It; the 20's party and the Hamilton trip. Alan Minson reported on a new member who he chased down of the road and gave one of the Clubs cards, welcome Richard Hurst. He had owned the car 5 years and didn't know the club existed.

A notice from the Ford Club on their Labour weekend trip to Coromandel and welcomed any Model A's along.

A letter was received from NZ Customs Dept, informing the club that cars built before 1931 were considered Vintage, and as such were free from import duties and taxes, and that parts of motor vehicles were currently considered to require an import license and were due for payment of duty and taxes. No provision exists for Club's duty or tax to be waived as they are not considered suitable for any concession. Restoring the flexible front engine mount was reported in a technical article, as was overhauling the distributor both from USA sources.



#### DO YOU KNOW THE MODEL "A"?

A Course of Questions with Detailed Answers Covering Various Mechanical Phases of the NEW FORD.

#### THE POWER PLANT.

**Question 5**. What is the firing order of the new FORD? Is this the same as the firing order of the Model T FORD?

**Answer 5**. The firing order of the new Model A FORD is "1, 2, 4, 3"-the same as that of the Model T FORD.

**Question 6.**? What is the bore and stroke of the new Model A FORD? What was the bore and stroke of the Model T FORD?

**Answer 6**. The bore of the new FORD engine 3  $^{7/8}$ inches, with a stroke of  $4^{1/4}$  inches The bore of the Model T FORD. was  $3^{3/4}$  inches, with a stroke of 4 inches.

**Question 7**. What is the piston displacement of the new FORD? What was the piston displacement of the Model T? How do they compare?

**Answer 7**. The piston displacement of the new FORD is 200.5 cubic inches. The piston displacement of the Model T FORD was 176.7 cubic inches. In other words, the new FORD has about one-eight or 12.5 per cent. more piston displacement.

**Question 8.** What is the actual brake horse-power of the new Model A FORD? What was that of the Model T Ford? How does the increase in actual brake horse-power compare with the increase in engine size as represented by piston displacement?

**Answer 8.** The actual brake horse-power of the new FORD engine is 40 horse-power at 2.200 revolutions per minute. The actual brake horse-power of the Model T FORD engine was 18 or 19, at 1,600 revolutions per minute, which is to say that the horse-power has been increased by over 100 per. cent.

Seems to be complete body on chassis with all running gear on wheels but no tyres, engine is in place, carburettor in a box, too. Both front and rear seat frames are there, front has been repaired, rear is new: no seat springs, no upholstery. Two of: headlight bars, dash panels, bonnets (hoods).

All four mudguards (fenders) present, maybe repaired, running boards appear new, valences in very good order have "humps", the doors have external handles

Hood-bows present but appear incomplete, but old hood fabric is there. Looks like a reconditioned radiator, and there is another used one. New windscreen surround, but we did not see windscreen stanchions.

A lot of new bits including radiator surround, headlamps, bumpers, hubcaps, horn, with many new smaller items in plastic bags. Many spares; wheels, axles and housings with more in the pit under the car which we are yet to see.
