#### Air filter attachments & a display at MOTAT

It's 16 September. Already our Club has seen 2 events of note this month. A tech night at Terry Costello's Model A Headquarters, handily located in Onehunga. And a display of 14 spiffy Model A's at the Museum of Transport & Technology (MOTAT), Western Springs.

Tech night, Wednesday 11

September Martin Rees provided a well-attended update on the development of his Zenith carburettor inlet attachment. Plus

the necessary kit of simple components to connect the attachment with an air filter. He also shared photos of alternative

attachments he'd collected.

Andrew Costello covered downdraft Weber and Stromberg carbys – I notice gaining in popularity on Club cars. One of the



benefits of course is they come with an air filter/s as part of the kit. Samples of both downdraft options were displayed, with discussion on the night.

David Mossman too, talked about air filter capacity – size matters as an original Zenith carburettor needs around 100 cubic feet of air, per minute (CFM).

Calculating CFM (from Ford Barn) -

- 1. Standard (non-bored) Model A engine displacement = 200.5 cu. inches.
- 2. Divide cu. inch displacement by 1728 (cu. inches in a cu. foot) = 0.116.
- 3. Divide rpm by 2 (2 revs per intake stroke). Say upper range of 2400 rpm  $\div$  2 = 1200.
- 4. Volumetric efficiency, esp. with air filter = around 75%.
- 5.  $0.116 \times 1200 \times 75\% = 104 \text{ CFM}.$

This ties nicely to the B-14 Zenith Service Manual -

2400 rpm + 200 cu. inch displacement (stock bore) = 104 CFM, per the Manual.

Sausages sizzled on the Club barbecue and a selection of shared supper items, completed a good evening. I was fortunate to score the last piece of Margaret Watson's delish ginger crunch!

**The Handbrake Award** has been applied to two people recently for being the perpetrators in the following story.

**Never start your vintage or classic** in the garage, in a carpark, or anywhere for that matter whilst you are standing beside it, reaching in to turn the ignition on....you have no control!!! AND it might be in gear.

Recently we were at a Model A car club event where I asked a Model A owner if he'd mind lifting his bonnet so I could listen to his motor with the stethoscope we had borrowed from Mike Courtney.

Why you ask?? I wanted to listen to another Model A motor and compare it with our motor because we thought we had a noise at revs in our Model A motor that should not be there.

Said owner was only too happy to serve and he started the car by opening the door, reaching in to switch on the ignition without checking the gear lever position. The car was in reverse, the motor started, the car moved back. The modern car parked beside got it's driver wing mirror swiped off by the A's open door and the door stay of the A was broken.

I felt responsible although I know it wasn't my fault that he left his A in gear....the motor sounded no different to ours and we later found that our exhaust had a gasket between the manifold and the downpipes that had come a fraction loose and at higher revs that was making the sound that we were hearing!!!

**NOW....We have a tandem** garage with a level floor where our Daimler SP250 and Model A live and a few weeks after the above incident, we were about to go out in the Daimler which was the rear car in the garage, in other words, the car closest to the open garage door. I was at the front of the garage storing the ladder against the work bench when Keith started the Daimler, without getting in, to warm it up, and it was in gear. Leaving it in gear is something that neither of us would normally do when parking the car at home, at rest. All hell broke loose.

The Daimler shot forward, wedged itself under the back bar on the Model A and the Model A shot forward (it was out of gear and no handbrake on as is normal for both cars) and squeezed me against the ladder against the work bench.

OMG, screaming 'get the bloody thing off me' Keith had to get into the Daimler put it

into reverse to pull it out from being wedged under the back bar of the Model A, move it back, get out, pull the Model A off me then I had to check my legs for damage. Arnica cream is a must in every household.

I immediately dropped trou, fur hat and jacket still on, rubbed arnica cream everywhere it was hurting on my legs and so with a mangled nose on the Daimler and still in shock, we headed off on the club event.

To cut a long story short, I ended the day hobbling into Shore Care, paid for a few foot X-Rays and came away a few hours later in a moon boot and attempting to master crutches as my right foot was badly injured which I didn't realise at the accident scene.

I have put the fear of death into Keith!! He is NEVER to start any old car 'to warm it up' without sitting in the driver seat EVER AGAIN !!!! and being in total control of the cockpit starting procedure.

GRRRRRRRRR:

I later heard that only last year a man on the North Shore had accidently killed his wife by doing exactly this same starting procedure in his garage. Please don't be complacent.....get into the cockpit and adjust and check everything BEFORE you start the engine!!!!

Four weeks have passed since the accident, my legs and foot are still showing bruising and the foot is still slightly swollen.



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
#### The Beatles remove a Gearbox
